## Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP)

## What is the Transportation Alternatives Program?

The Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) was established under the federal transportation bill referred to as MAP-21. TAP is for community based projects that expand travel choices and enhance the transportation experience by integrating modes and improving the cultural, historic, and environmental aspects of our transportation infrastructure.

## Who can apply for TAP funding?

Only eligible applicants can apply for funding. Eligible applicants include counties, cities over 5,000 people, state agencies, Native American Tribes, and Regional
Development Commissions. If an entity such as a township, school, or non-profit organization would like to submit a proposal, that entity must have an eligible applicant sponsor the proposal.

## How much money is available?

The maximum amount that each project can request in a given grant cycle is $\$ 600,000$. The minimum amount that can be requested is $\$ 100,000$.

## Is there a local match that is required?

Yes. All projects require a $20 \%$ local match of the eligible project costs, including Safe Routes to School projects.

## How does the funding cycle work?

The solicitation is taking place through the fall 2015 for projects that will be ready for construction in Federal Fiscal Year 2020 (fall 2019).

## Who reviews and evaluates the applications?

The Northeast Minnesota Area Transportation Partnership (ATP), a board of elected officials, state agency representatives, and transportation experts is responsible for identifying projects to receive federal funds. The ATP has appointed a TAP Task Force working group that reviews and suggests projects to the ATP.

## Will the review process be competitive?

Yes. Approximately $\$ 900,000$ will be available for Federal Fiscal Year 2020 funds in Northeast Minnesota (this includes the counties of Aitkin, Carlton, Cook, Itasca, Koochiching, Lake, Pine, and St. Louis).

## Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP)

TAP projects are community based projects that expand travel choices and enhance the transportation experience by integrating modes and improving the cultural, historic, and environmental aspects of our transportation infrastructure. The TAP provides for the implementation of a variety of projects, with examples of projects that include pedestrian and bicycle facilities for non-drivers, scenic turnouts and overlooks, mitigation of water pollution from highway runoff, and improvements to historic transportation facilities.

## The Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) $\mathbf{2 0 2 0}$ solicitation process taking place in Fall 2015

This year's process began October 1, 2015 with the announcement of the Letter of Intent (LOI) form being open for submittal. To assist potential applicants, the Northeast Minnesota Area Transportation Partnership (ATP) hosted a TAP Workshop that was facilitated by the Arrowhead Regional Development Commission (ARDC) and the Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT). The workshop was webinar based and was designed to explain the TAP and answer questions related to applying and delivering projects. The Fall 2015 workshop can be found at www.nemnatp.org/tap. The LOI is due October 30, 2015 and will be accompanied by a regional/statewide discussion with the LOI applicant to ensure all TAP requirements are understood. Eligible project applicants will be provided with the final application that will be due January 8,2016 . The applications will be reviewed and selected for recommendation by the ATP and its sub-groups in February through April. Applicants will be notified if their project was selected by April 15, 2016.

The Arrowhead Regional Development Commission (ARDC) provides facilitation and staff services to the ATP TAP Task Force, which is a working group that recommends projects for funding under the TAP. ARDC also communicates the priorities of the ATP to local officials and transportation stakeholders, and provides staffing to the Regional Transportation Advisory Committee (RTAC) and the ATP. ## Combination Wine/Strong Beer License

WHEREAS, M.S. 340A. 404 Subd 5 authorizes the Board of Commissioners to adopt an ordinance enabling establishments who hold both an On-Sale Wine License and On-Sale 3.2 Beer License to sell intoxicating malt liquor at on-sale without an additional license, and

WHEREAS, in accordance with M.S. 375.51, a Public Hearing was held on July 14, 2015 regarding adoption of said ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Commissioners of Aitkin County, Minnesota, approves an ordinance enabling a holder of an On-Sale Wine License and On-Sale 3.2 Beer License and whose gross receipts are at least 60 percent attributable to the sale of food, to sell intoxicating malt liquor at a fee as established by the County Board.

As of March 1, 2016, Aitkin County supervises 810 cases and 678 clients. Of the cases being supervised by the Aitkin Office 411 clients are residents of Aitkin County. This is approximately $2.6 \%$ of our total population living in the county. This number includes those who are residents of Aitkin County, but were sentenced in another Minnesota County or State. Of the 411, 73 clients are juvenile clients on either supervision or participate in diversion programming.

There are an additional 115 clients who were sentenced in our court but transferred to their county of residence for supervision. Further, Aitkin County has 110 active warrants that are not included in the aforementioned numbers. Active warrants include both residents and non-residents.
