When this feedback and input are gathered a sample format will be presented for the commissioners to discuss. 4. Mental Health Housing Resolution a. Our county has been asked by AMC to support a resolution related to mental health bonding which will assist with the development of mental health services along the continuum of care. This resolution is on the main board meeting agenda and will need action. b. The resolution basically states that our County supports State Capital investments to improve the mental health continuum of care. Specifically triage centers and increased housing options. c. The need for various mental health services is so much greater than the resources that are available. This resolution will not fix all the problems we experience in this area but this resolution is a start and we need to start somewhere. Aitkin County Board of Commissioners,

I have included price quotes for Police Package Ford vehicles. There are quotes for a sedan (Ford Taurus) and quotes for an SUV (Ford Explorer).

I have confined the quotes to Ford vehicles only since Chevrolet has discontinued production on Police Package vehicles, with the exception of the Chevrolet Tahoe. In the past, the Tahoe has been priced considerably higher so I did not price one this year. Dodge does manufacture Police Package vehicles but it would be cost prohibited to consider Dodge since there is no local dealership and considerable time is invested in maintenance, warranty service, and recalls.

I recommend the purchase of "2" Ford Taurus (sedans) from Ford of Hibbing at the state bid price of \$24,625.45 per vehicle for a total cost of \$49,250.90. I also recommend the purchase of "2" Ford Explorers (SUVs) from Ford of Hibbing at the state bid price of \$28,784.95 for a total of \$57,569.90. The total cost for the 4 vehicles recommended is \$106,820.80. Sheriff Turner budgeted \$115,000. for 2018.

Aitkin Motors did submit bids for both vehicles but they were higher in price then the state bid pricing.

Resolution Authorizing Issuance and Sale of General Obligation Capital Improvement Plan Bonds, Series 2018A

The proceeds of the Bonds will be used for the purpose of financing the construction of an addition to the existing County courthouse, public safety and security improvements to existing facilities, the remodeling of existing facilities and the demolition of the West Annex addition to the courthouse, and other related building and grounds improvements described in the County's 2017-2022 Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan.

SECTION 2. <u>TERMS OF PROPOSAL</u>. Springsted Incorporated, municipal advisor to the County, has presented to this Board a form of Terms of Proposal for the Bonds which is attached hereto and hereby approved and shall be placed on file by the County Administrator. The Terms of Proposal are hereby adopted as the terms and conditions of the Bonds and of the sale thereof, subject to adjustment for issue price compliance terms that may be required prior to the date of sale. Springsted Incorporated is hereby authorized to solicit proposals for the Bonds on behalf of the County on a competitive basis without requirement of published notice.

SECTION 3. <u>SALE MEETING</u>. This Board shall meet on April 10, 2018, at 11:00 a.m. for the purpose of considering proposals for the purchase of the Bonds and of taking such action thereon as may be in the best interests of the County.
